This celebration of humanity's transcendent arts — food, wine and great verse — begins at 6:00PM with champagne toasts at Poets House at 10 River Terrace (at Murray Street), then moves to the North End Grill at 104 North End Avenue at 7:00PM for dinner and much more.

"Food and poetry are a natural pairing," said Poets House Executive Director Lee Briccetti. "As the poet Joy Harjo wrote, 'The world begins at a kitchen table.' This event marks a truly poetic table and helps to support Poets House, one of the great places for poetry on the globe."

Poets House is a 50,000-volume poetry library and a national literary center that invites poets and the public to step into the living tradition of poetry. Poets House—through its poetry resources, literary events for adults and children, and exhibitions—documents the wealth and diversity of

modern poetry and stimulates public dialogue on issues related to poetry in culture. Founded in 1985 by two-time Poet Laureate Stanley Kunitz and legendary arts administrator Elizabeth Kray, the library has created a home for all who read and write poetry. In 2009, Poets House moved into its permanent home, at 10 River Terrace in Battery Park City, on the banks of the Hudson River. Last year, 65,000 people visited Poets House, and over five million were introduced to Poets House via its new website and national partnerships.
